Strategy 1:

Interview Seminar - The interview Seminar is geared to preparatory seniors in CTE courses. It is designed to instruct/train students in soft skills needed to attain and maintain employments. The seminar uses local business and industry representatives in key roles in presenting the material. The goal of the seminar is to cover and reinforce topics that are covered on the KOSSA and Workkeys exams to help students better understand soft skill items on the exams.
